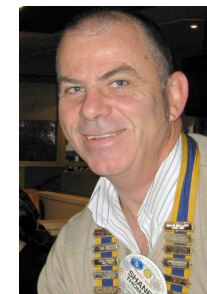

Our special guests were the Hosking twins, Sarah, Nicholas and Ella Sharman, Marie, JA and Jane and the power behind the President, Genevieve.

Speaker/Host: Rory Sackville, St Kilda's Community Programs Manager

Rory commenced by presenting Marie with a Saint's scarf. He told us that he had been on the team since 2004 and proceeded to detail the splendid site, followed by a tour, which did not include the players' rec room and locker area. The Belvedere Park complex includes an AFL MCG sized oval, gymnasium, rehabilitation pool, meeting rooms, lecture theatre and an indoor sports hall for basketball, netball and other sports that will be made available to local schools, health providers and sporting associations after further organisation.

The project would not have been possible without the significant contribution from the funding partners including the Victorian State Government (\$3.45m), Frankston City Council (\$3m), AFL (\$2.55m) and the St Kilda Football Club (\$1.43m, plus all additional costs) while the Council's own REPLAN economic impact study has forecasted over \$42.5m p.a. of on-flow benefits to the local community now the Saints have settled in Frankston.

St Kilda's former CEO is quoted as saying, "St Kilda's move to Frankston is part of the Club's long-term strategic plan to continue our growth and develop the Saints as the 'Bayside's Own Club' we are unashamedly setting out to win the hearts and minds and convert locals into long term Saints members and supporters throughout the length and depth of the Bayside corridor.

This new elite facility will not only be of great benefit to our Club in a football sense, but it also creates a vibrant sporting precinct for the entire community to use, which is an outstanding outcome for local residents as well as the St Kilda Football Club."
